#### PE KIT

PE Kit is yellow t shirt and black jumper/hoodie and joggers.

On gymnastics days children should wear shorts under their joggers. Gymnastics days will be confirmed in the new year. Please ensure that shoes worn for PE are suitable for high levels of activity. If children are not able to do laces up, make sure they have shoes which they can easily do up themselves.

Children should not wear earrings or other jewellery for PE. These should be removed prior to the lesson by the child or parent. If this is not possible parents may choose to cover their child's earrings in plasters or tape. If tape is being used to cover earrings it will depend on the lesson whether the child will take a full participating role.

School Lunches are now to be pre-ordered—an online form will be sent out on a Monday for the lunches for the following week. If a form is not submitted, you will need to send your child into school the following week with a packed lunch.

The gate for School Drop off opens at 8.40am and closes at 8.55am. If you arrive after this time, your child may receive a late mark.
