- 1) Answer: False. The game Among Us is set on a spaceship.
- 2) Answer: True. There are over 40 million games on Roblox and there is an option to chat to friends. Note for parents or carers: We recommend disabling the chat feature on your child's account so they can't be contacted by people they don't know. Visit our Net Aware Roblox review for more information on how to do this.
- 3) Answer: False. You can set an account to private on TikTok so only people who follow you can see the videos you post. Other users can still see your username and profile pictures.
  - Note for parents and carers: We recommend that anyone under the age of 16 sets their account to private. Visit our Net Aware TikTok review for more information on how to do this.
- 4) Answer: True. Poplam is only open between 6am and 11pm.
- 5) Answer: True. Enabling 'Ghost Mode' on Snapchat hides your location from others. Note for parents and carers: We recommend making sure this is switched on so people can't see your child's location.

#### **Section 3**

**Scenarios** 

- 1) Answer: A. If you receive a DM from someone you don't know decline the request straight away and tell an adult you trust.
- 2) Answer: B or C. If someone sends you an upsetting message online you should never reply straight away. We would recommend taking a break from your screen to calm down and ask an adult for advice if you need to. If you feel comfortable you might want to report or block them.
- 3) Answer: C. There are risks talking to people you don't know online so you should never video call or speak to someone you don't know online without talking to your parent or carer about it first.
- 4) Answer: A and B. You should never include any personal information in videos you post online as it might make it easier for people you don't know to find out information about you. We recommend only sharing your TikTok videos with people you know from school or other offline activities. Make sure to always watch your video back before you post it and double check it doesn't include information like names, locations and school uniforms.
